
### Proper Preface (Full)

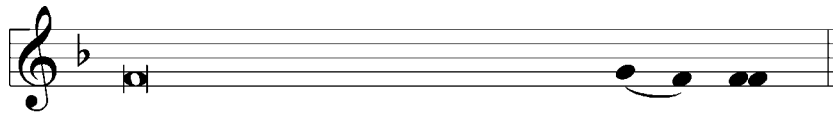

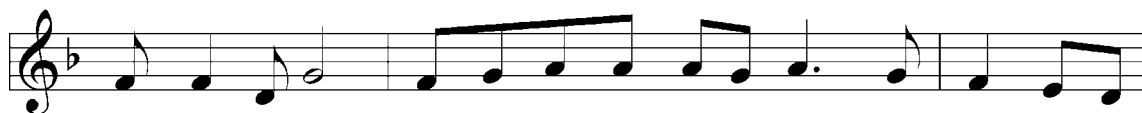
